2. City of Sarasota Homelessness Response – Kevin Stiff

- Housing First since 2017. To do this the Homeless Outreach Teams, consists of police officer and case manager work to contact every homeless person in Sarasota to help them find a way to get out of homelessness. Want to help and sustain their housing without having to be "fixed" first. Most people who are experiencing homelessness or living on the street just need a little assistance. Main goal is outreach and coordinated entry.
 - City makes available 20 beds each night at Salvation Army for those who want help.
 - For those that are able bodies adults, the city helps fund "street teams" where they can do work around the city like clean up trash.
 - They spend time at the Salvation Army, and work on finding employment
 - For those that are disabled, mentally or physically the goal is to get them into housing, then help addressing other needs.
 - Permanent support housing for chronic individuals: work with programs to get them permanent housing for however long they need.
 - Emergency services are also offered: including change of clothes, dinner, breakfast, shower, and place to sleep. Those will be given for free to those that are seeking and working with the program to end their homelessness, and if not in a program it is a \$12 fee.
 - The city budget for this program is ~\$1 million.
 - Effective case management is key, working with those who want to end their homelessness until they get a home, and 1 year after they have been homed.

4. CHAT Announcements – While we did not get to these items here is some updates on other things going on in the Newtown community.

- COVID updates
 - COVID updates Currently first and second dose appointments are continuing at Sarasota Square Mall. We are currently giving out the Moderna vaccine
 - As of Monday March 15, anyone 60+, health care worker, school employee, law enforcement, firefighters, and those determined vulnerable by their physicians are eligible for the vaccine. Anyone over the age of 18 can sign up on the Everbridge website and will receive an account number when it is their turn to become eligible.
 - Other state and federal popup sites are continuing to happen sporadically
 - State sites at the Tampa Greyhound track have on average been giving out around 2000 vaccines a day with availability of 3000, if you feel comfortable getting yourself to that location it could be an option.
