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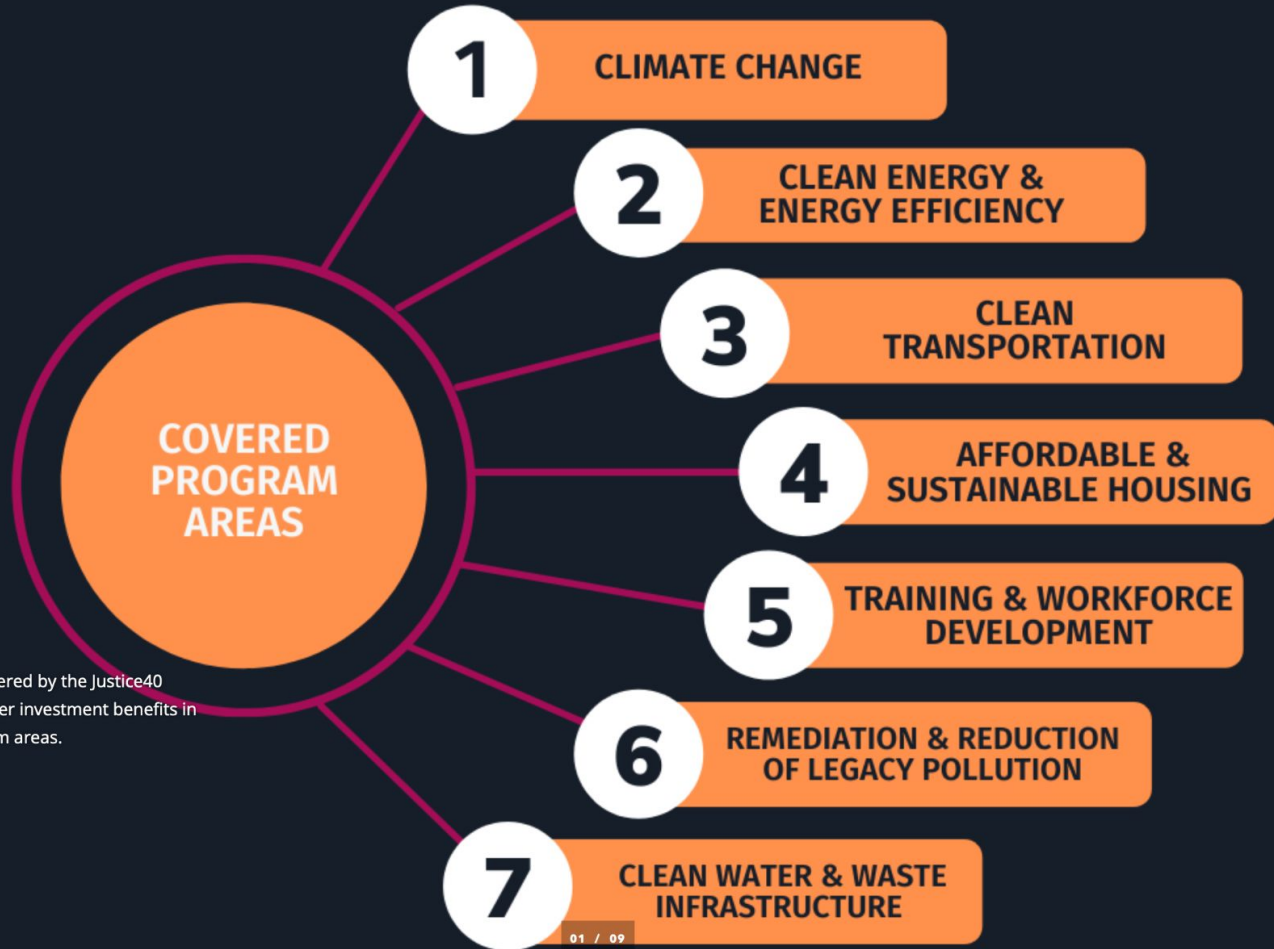

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About Justice40

On January 27, 2021, President Biden signed Executive Order 14008, which tasked a group of executive branch officials with developing recommendations for ensuring that 40% of the overall benefits of federal investments in climate-related programs flow to disadvantaged communities – the Justice40 Initiative (J40I). The J40I does not include specifically earmarked funds but is rather a "whole-of-government approach" to advancing towards environmental justice and economic inclusion.



Sec. 223. Justice40 Initiative. (a) Within 120 days of the date of this order, the Chair of the Council on Environmental Quality, the Director of the Office of Management and Budget, and the National Climate Advisor, in consultation with the Advisory Council, shall jointly publish recommendations on how certain Federal investments might be made toward a goal that 40 percent of the overall benefits flow to disadvantaged communities. The recommendations shall focus on investments in the areas of clean energy and energy efficiency; clean transit; affordable and sustainable housing; training and workforce development; the remediation and reduction of legacy pollution; and the development of critical clean water infrastructure. The recommendations shall reflect existing authorities the agencies may possess for achieving the 40-percent goal as well as recommendations on any legislation needed to achieve the 40-percent goal.



Agency grant programs covered by the Justice40 mandate are those that cover investment benefits in one or multiple of 7 program areas.

CLIMATE CHANGE

Creation of community resilience plans that specifically include addressing needs of disadvantaged communities

CLEAN ENERGY & ENERGY EFFICIENCY

Reduction of energy burden

CLEAN TRANSPORTATION

Reduction of exposure to harmful transportation-related emission

AFFORDABLE & SUSTAINABLE HOUSING

Availability and access to affordable green housing

TRAINING & WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

Good job training programs particularly for disadvantaged communities, including formerly incarcerated individuals

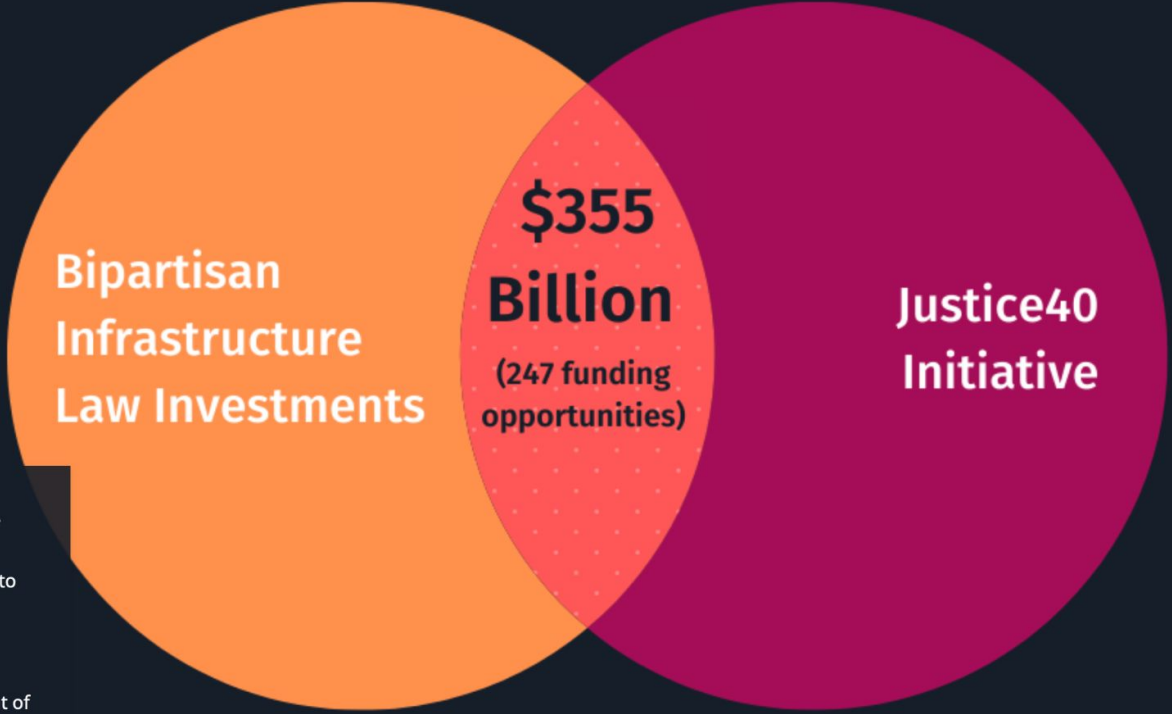
REMEDIATION & REDUCTION OF LEGACY POLLUTION

Reduction in farmworker exposure to pesticides

CLEAN WATER & WASTE INFRASTRUCTURE

Replacement of lead service lines

Examples of benefits of covered programs:



Around \$355 billion of the BIL investment over the next few years is related to projects that could fall under the reach of the Justice40 initiative (i.e. tied to clean energy and energy efficiency; clean transit; affordable and sustainable housing; training and workforce development; the remediation and reduction of legacy pollution; and the development of critical clean water infrastructure).

Of the subset of funding related to Justice40 in the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, approximately \$36.4 billion (through 62 projects) is eligible for non-profits or community organizations to apply for.

Data Limitations

- The **United States and the District of Columbia** currently have **25/25** (100%) possible parameters to determine Justice40 categories.
- In the CEJST, **Puerto Rico** currently has **6/25** (~25%) and the **American Samoa and Northern Mariana Islands** currently has **4/25** (~16%) of possible parameters to determine Justice40 categories.
